Congratulations to Lion Ann Favreau on the Publication of Her New Book



Venice Lions and Shriners Work Together



Pop tab collection began back in 1993 with Marylou Ellis and the Lady Shriners as their project. Only the tabs were collected to avoid trying to store the whole cans for recycling and the ladies could put pop tabs in their pocketbooks. Fred Ellis, a Shriner, became involved and is the only recycle person in this area. This Shriners project runs from Tampa down to Ft. Myers.

Fred has totally dedicated a garage to this project and is delighted that our Youth Recycle Group has done so much to add to the Shriners collection. Fred delivers the tabs to the metal recyclers, getting the best price of the day. He then turns the recycle monies over to the Shriners organization to financially help rebuild wheel chairs, buy books, games, etc. Since 2020, City of Venice school students have collected 641.5 lbs. of tabs.

This is such a good example of when service organization clubs work together.
