# Meet the Gurleys

**Lions June and Al Gurley** joined the Venice Lions on May 3rd, 2018.

Since then Lions Al and June worked together on the Sunshine Committee sending birthday and anniversary greetings to Club members. June also worked in the Lions Vision office. Al's devotion to June would have him coming to the office during her shift to make sure she was OK.

Al and June joined Venice Lions due on the recommendation of their Audiologist, Dr. Rick Namikas. We are so grateful that he referred them to us.

Looking back in time, Lion June and Al's student days at Florida State University united them. Lion Al was from North Carolina while June was born and raised as a local gal in our very own Nokomis. June not only attended Laurel Elementary, graduated from Venice High School, but actually taught a year at the newly opened Venice Elementary in 1954.

Lion June's parents worked during the summer carnivals, so she got to travel in the summers but returned every fall for school in Nokomis.

Lion Al was able to obtain his degree from Florida State by enlisting in the Air Force. He received a degree in Engineering and Meteorology. Lion Al became a weatherman – who would have thought it – but this gave him great pleasure.

While in the service Lion Al was stationed in France. During that time he took off ten days to return home to marry his college sweetheart in Dec. of 1954.

And so began an enduring relationship that is approaching its 70th year. After their wedding Al swept his bride back to France where she was able to teach on a military base for a semester.

However, the Air Force made a mistake when they asked Al to go to Japan. He turned down the request when June refused to go.

After military service Lion AI took a job with the Westinghouse Corporation. They moved to Pittsburgh where AI worked on the first atomic submarine.

Al later took a job with Western Electric in Baltimore where they raised their family. Thankfully when they retired 30 years ago, they came back to the Venice area to help care for June's Mother who never left the area.

June enjoys reading while Al is still into wood carving after 29 years of being involved with woodworking clubs in Venice and North Port.

We are so grateful that they found their way to our Venice Lions Club.
